Petty Memorial Lecture: Dr. Scott Shields on Richard Diebenkorn Exhibit at David Owsley Museum of Art

MUNCIE, Indiana. – The David Owsley Museum of Art (DOMA) will host Dr. Scott Shields for a Petty Memorial Lecture from 5 to 8 p.m. on Thursday, April 19, in the David Owsley Museum of Art.

Dr. Scott Shields is the curator of <u>Richard Diebenkorn: Beginnings, 1942-1955</u>, the special exhibition on display at DOMA until May 20, 2018, and associate director and chief curator of the Crocker Art Museum in Sacramento, California.

Shields will discuss the life and works of Diebenkorn and the process of curating this special collection of 100 paintings and drawings, currently on display for the first time in the Midwest.

Organized by Richard Diebenkorn Foundation in conjunction with Shields and the Crocker, this traveling exhibition is the first to solely examine the work Diebenkorn made prior to his return to figuration.
