Chris Rob with **Brandon Markell Holmes**

Chris Rob is a singer/songwriter, multi-instrumentalist, and producer with a twist of hip hop, house, and cool funk, all which can be heard on his recently released *Everything's Beautiful*, the Robert Glasper executive produced Miles Davis remix album. The final track, "Right On Brotha" featuring Stevie Wonder was co-written and produced by Rob with the industry heavyweight DJ Spinna. Rob has also served as an opening act for Stevie Wonder as well as serving as his musical director for President Obama's inauguration. Chris Rob is currently promoting his latest project *Sound Of Da Struggle*. His project *Mental Notes* was named among the top soul albums of 2010 by Soultracks, with selections from the album featured in the Tyler Perry film *Peeples* as well as the award-winning Showtime documentary *Phunny Business*. He also tours and directs music for his older brother, actor/comedian Craig Robinson (*Hot Tub Time Machine, Morris From America*) and has been seen alongside Robinson on NBC sitcoms "The Office" and "Mr. Robinson" as well as in "Hyped For Halftime," a series of commercials promoting last year's Superbowl Halftime Show.

Kevin Whalum

The younger brother of noted jazz saxman Kirk Whalum, vocalist **Kevin Whalum** grew up in Memphis in the shadow of Olivet Baptist Church, where his father, the Rev. Kenneth T. Whalum, served as pastor. The church, known as a magnet for great singers and musicians, became a centerpiece of Kevin's life as a youngster, creating both a religious and a musical foundation.

After graduating with a degree in English from Morehouse, Whalum moved to Chicago to pursue a career in music. Less than six months after his arrival, he had formed a jazz-funk-soul group called Kevin Whalum & Fast Forward. He later moved to Nashville and appeared as a guest vocalist on brother Kirk's noted 1997 release, *The Gospel According To Jazz, Chapter 1*, and as part of Kirk's band at that year's Stellar Awards. Kevin now has three solo albums under his belt: the self-produced solo debut, *Timetable* (2002); the George Duke-produced, *One Life To Love* (2008); and his self-produced, *I Live For You* (2016). Although Kevin eschews any effort to force him into a category or genre', he freely admits to defining himself as "primarily a jazz vocalist who just happens to be a Christian."

Ari Hest

Ari Hest has been making music and touring for about 15 years. Growing up outside New York City, he began playing guitar in the hallways of his high school, learning the songs of The Beatles, Peter Gabriel, Smashing Pumpkins, and Dave Matthews Band. Hest has played in every state in the U.S., toured extensively throughout Europe, and has had the honor of playing with a slew of incredible musicians. Hest just released his ninth LP, *Natural*, and he's also released three solo EPs as well as a song-a-week project called "52." He is also in three bands that have recorded albums over the past few years: The Open Sea with Rosi Golan, Bluebirds of Paradise with Chrissi Poland, and, most recently, a duets album with Judy Collins called *Silver Skies Blue*, which was nominated for a Grammy award for "Best Folk Album" of 2017. His music can be heard on TV or in movies – *The Path, The Lincoln Lawyer*, "Private Practice," "Army Wives," and "One Tree Hill" to name a few. He's also scored music for a film called *Dreamriders*, a documentary which won several independent film awards.

Jeff Bradshaw & friends featuring Glenn Lewis & Teedra Moses

Born in North Philadelphia, **Jeff Bradshaw** is known as a soul-jazz and hip-hop/funk innovator, so it was only right that this trombone virtuoso found a home at Hidden Beach Recordings. Coming up in and out of the Philadelphia Soul Movement, Bradshaw has performed along some of the music industry's greats – Michael Jackson, Earth, Wind & Fire, and Pattie LaBelle, to name a few. In 2004, he released his solo debut *Bone Deep*, which earned him critical acclaim throughout the industry and among his fans. His signature smooth sound secured his consistent spot on the festival circuit as a solo act and as a guest to artists such as Jill Scott, the Roots, and Mary J. Blige. His sophomore album at Hidden Beach, *Bone Appetit*, was a 2-disc release that featured a host of guest performers, including Raheem DeVaughn, Marsha Ambrosius, and his Hidden Beach label mates Kindred the Family Soul.

Jane Monheit

Jane Monheit is establishing herself as one of today's best and most important vocalist-musicians. With her new album, *The Songbook Sessions: Ella Fitzgerald*—the first to be released on her own Emerald City Records—the Long Island native pays tribute to Ella while sharing a definitive portrait of herself, guided by her producer, arranger, and trumpet great Nicholas Payton. Throughout the recording, Monheit's gorgeous upward swoop is pure Ella, her earthy

wordless phrases pure Sarah, and she offers a classic example of a singer leading her influences rather than being led by them.

Once a refrigerated food distribution warehouse, the 1911 building has been transformed into a contemporary 33,000 square foot haven for those passionate about wine, music and culinary arts. The décor evokes the romance of being in wine country, from the exposed

stainless steel fermenting tanks and French oak barrels, to the aroma of fermenting grapes. The West Loop's only fully operation winery has produced dozens of in-house wines sourced from vineyards in California, Oregon, Washington, Argentina and Chile, including a Wine Enthusiast 92-point 2015 Verna's Vineyard Reserve Pinot Noir. With more than 400 unique producers from around the world City Winery is recognized with 2014 and 2015 Best of Awards of Excellence "for having one of the most outstanding restaurant wine lists in the world" by *Wine Spectator*. The globally inspired, locally sourced, winefocused food menu is conceived for pairing and sharing. The concert hall accommodates up to 300 guests, all seated at tables with complete beverage and dining service, ensuring a comfortable "listening room" experience enhanced by a state-of-the-art Meyer Sound system.
